CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

We are a nonprofit Christian community preschool. We welcome each child with Christian love and concern, and we treat each student as a unique child of God. We hope this environment will build feelings of self-worth and self-confidence and that these attitudes will serve our children all of their lives.

Our preschool is located at 11902 Old Shelbyville Road in Middletown, Kentucky and has been in operation for 37 years. We are a licensed preschool and all of our teachers have college degrees. Every year we evaluate our program and strive to offer your child the very best preschool education possible.

We try to maintain a good balance of activities at our school. When appropriate in developing our units, we take field trips and bring in resource programs. We also use our kitchen for cooking. Our four and five year olds attend chapel once a week, and the two and three year olds once a month. Music is offered daily for all the children. Parents are encouraged to be an integral part of the school program. Teachers communicate frequently with parents, and parents are invited to visit, work as volunteers, come to conferences and attend programs.

Our school year begins a week after Jefferson County public schools and ends a week before them. We follow Jefferson County's public school calendar during those nine months. We have a "Parent Orientation" and a "Student Visitation" before school starts. The age cut-off date is October 1st (unless specified above). The student, teacher ratio is 6:1 for the 2's, 10:1 for the 3's, 12:1 for the 4's and 12:1 for the 5's.

COST

Tuition is based on the actual cost of operating the school. Monthly fees for the 2006-07 school year are:

\$125.00 for 2-day 2's and 3's program
\$160.00 for 3-day 3's and 4's program
\$225.00 for 5-day 4's and 5's program

A non-refundable registration fee of \$100 per child and first month's tuition is payable when you enroll.

CURRICULUM FOR 2's, 3's, 4's and 5's

Our curriculum is based on unit activities which are developmentally appropriate for preschool children. Efforts are made to provide ways in which the children can grow spiritually, physically, socially, emotionally and cognitively. "Hands on" concrete experiences are an important part of everyday planning.

Our educational activities may be structured, but children are also given the chance to choose how they want to spend school time. Provisions are made for developing large and small muscle motor skills, and many opportunities are provided for stimulating language and building social skills. Learning to listen and learning to follow directions are essential to successful participation in the program.

Children are naturally curious and eager to learn. Nurturing the whole child is basic to our educational vision. We strive to provide an environment in which each child continues to love learning and looks forward to a lifetime of educational opportunities.
